

Lesson 3-Progressive Tense

in English- Level 1

Subject	+ [Be +V-ing]	+ Object	
I	am eating	a sandwich.	(present)
Carl	was drinking	Juice.	(past)



The present progressive tense is used for an ongoing action in the present.

The past progressive tense is used to describe an ongoing activity in the past.

Present Progressive Tense

[To Eat]

I **am** eating.
You **are** eating.
He **is** eating.
We **are** eating.
You **are** eating.
They **are** eating.

Past Progressive Tense

[To Drink]

I **was** drinking
You **were** drinking
She **was** drinking
We **were** drinking
You **were** drinking
They **were** drinking

Negative Forms

[To Cook]

P r e s e n t
I am **not** cooking
You were not cooking
P a s t
We were not cooking
They **were not** cooking
